



Project


- Monitor stream water quality in the Matanuska River watershed

- Data provided to the EPA




Stream types

Equipment

- Handheld field monitoring equipment
 - YSI for pH, dissolved oxygen, temperature, specific conductance
 - Hanna for turbidity
 - GPS, camera



Winter Equipment

Add to equipment list:

- Snowshoes
- Trekking poles double as mini-ice augers
- Knife for scraping ice off equipment
- Long YSI cable
- Snow-measuring yardstick
- Warm clothing, handwarmers






Challenges: equipment

- DO calibration
 - Small amount of water freezes quickly
 - Cup threads ice up
- Turbidity
 - ice crystals in/on vials
- Photos
 - Camera battery goes dead in the cold
- Cold hands, stiff fingers!


Water quality results

- Cold
- Highly oxygenated
- Clear
- Neutral-alkaline pH

Temperature



Dissolved oxygen, mg/l




• Oxygenated

- Colder water, more oxygen
- Except the outlet of Wolverine Lake

Turbidity



- Turbidity is low
- Except some sites associated with canyons and/or glacial

Summary

- Winter challenges accessing water and operating equipment
- Winter water has low turbidity and high DO – data we would not have captured without winter sampling
- Waters are high quality year-round, with rare exceptions
- Chickaloon Native Village is the only entity monitoring water in the Matanuska watershed
