#### **Partnership Business**

- National Fish Habitat Partnership project funding
  - Update on status of FY23 funded projects and FY24 projects under review by NFHP Board (Trent Liebich and Jessica Speed) (5 min)

We annually compete for National Fish Habitat Partnership funds to cover much of the cost of the coordinator position and some basic operations, as well as funding local salmon habitat projects that meet the goals of the Strategic Action Plan.

- Trent: We received the funding. Trent plans to get emails out to recipients this week to guide them in how to get the money into their accounts.
- Jessica: we had 4 projects funded MSB fish passage, TTCD Elodea & AWC surveys, UAA stream temperature and Partnership coordination & outreach.

Action: Trent contact FY23 funding recipients to get cooperative agreement process going. Cc Jessica/reach out if Partnership coordinator can be of assistance.

 Review of FY24 NFHP project funding process – what went well and what can be improved for FY25? (Jessica Speed) (25 min) \*FY24 RFP Process for NFHP Funding Materials

*Jessica: Being reviewed now by the board for recommendation to Department of Interior. Feedback from the last funding process:* 

- Reminder: make sure that conversations where SC members leave the room due to conflicts of interest are not captured in the notes shared to the full SC or posted on the website.
- Jessica reviewed timeline for Partnership RFP timeline & process.
- Feedback for improvements:
  - Laurie Need to define tribal entities & the scoring for them
    - Are we intending for there to be such a heavy weight on those who can provide match and then favoring large projects that are likely to get funded as it is?
  - Michael if we are going to change priority objectives, we should do so sooner rather than later. In the past we waited until it was too late to alter. Suggested having a deadline during the September meeting so that we can announce at the Symposium.
    - o It would be great to have more definition of what is expected as monitoring.
  - Eric suggestions for more clarity around what outreach plan is expected for applicants and scoring them.
  - Jessica uploading into the NFHP database was a big project.

#### Actions:

- Laurie willing to draft a letter to the tribal liaison on the NFHP board regarding suggestions and challenges for tribal entities.
- Dedicate July or September Steering Committee meeting to discuss and review RFP -Preference for July
- Updates and Insights on National Fish Habitat Partnership Board and Mat-Su Borough Fish and Wildlife Commission Activity (Ted Eischeid, National Fish Habitat Partnership Board member/Mat-Su Borough) (10 min)

NFHP Board Update – Alaska partnerships had a good update call this morning. Ted has some suggestions for the partnerships to provide feedback to applicants as to why or why not they received the funding requested. Would like to see more staff support for FHP's.

- Suggested the Partnership draft a letter and request it to be included in the June 13th NFHP board meeting to highlight concerns and create the opportunity for the board to discuss and address. Note that Ted will not be in attendance.
- Board is working on NFHP priorities for FY25.
- Ted is determining whether or not he will apply to remain on the NFHP board.
- Status of Mat-Su Borough Riparian Set-back Ordinance (Ted Eischeid) (20 min)

End of last year two Assembly Members submitted a draft ordinance to repeal the MSB riparian setback ordinance. Was reviewed by the Planning Commission & Fish & Wildlife Commission. Both Commissions rejected the ordinance and the Assembly Members who had originally submitted it, pulled it. The Borough was requested to re-draft the ordinance with the suggestions provided by the commissions.

- Will be introduced on May 15<sup>th</sup> with the MSB Planning Commission, and hearing will be June 5<sup>th</sup> with the Planning Commission.
- New draft maintains 75- foot setback for streams & rivers. Maintains it for lakes but allows you to build within the 75-foot setback if it's not closer than 25 feet, and engineer sign-off on mitigation plan.
- Will be before the MSB Fish and Wildlife Commission at their May 18<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- Filling Vacant Partnership Committee Seats and Roles (Jessica Speed) (20 min)
  - Steering Committee (local government and at-large)

We have 10 steering committee seats, and currently 2 vacant seats (Local Gov & at large seat).

Would be great to have an MSB representative. FWC could make a motion to recommend someone.

# **Stream Quantification Tool: An Introduction and Potential Utility for Mat-Su**, Matthew LaCroix, U.S. Department of Environmental Protection (15 min)\* Brochure, intro video

- A stream quantification tool was generated for interior Alaska, and one is being created for the Arctic Coastal Plain and one will be created for the Cook Inlet basin.
- Basically, an excel spreadsheet developed to quantify functional change at the reach scale.
- Can help determine efficacy of restoration projects and help prioritize projects.
- The tool helps create a common language for agencies & stakeholder groups to communicate restoration & mitigation.
- Factors five functional categories of the stream function pyramid
- There was a suggestion to host a conversation regarding a Mat-Su SQT at the Symposium

- Jessica shared part of an email from Matt Varner re: the SQT tool:

A regional SQT would really benefit the Mat-Su since it would serve as the basis for determining Clean Water Act (CWA) 404 mitigation requirements for proposed development projects. Having a tool helps to ensure that impacts to aquatic habitats are fully acknowledged and either avoided or compensated for. In the absence of an SQT, impact assessments can be based on qualitative data and professional judgement which are more easily influenced by other socio-political factors. Bringing together diverse stakeholders around the idea of an SQT could help build consistency around habitat assessment methods and provide benefits well beyond CWA mitigation requirements. Some resources available to help shed light on the concept of an SQT include a brochure and a intro video. Folks that want to take a deeper dive could also look at the Interior Alaska SQT (link to tool and user manual).
