

Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund (PCSRF)

- **Program goals specific to Alaska:**
To support the maintenance of salmon populations that are necessary for Native subsistence fishing; as well as, conserve and improve salmon habitat.
- **Who is eligible to apply directly?**
Individual Tribes, Tribal Consortia, and ADFG.
- **Who is eligible to apply through AKSSF?**
Individual Tribes, Tribal Consortia, and NGOs.

**For PCSRF, the term “salmon” refers to all five species of Pacific salmon and steelhead*

Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Fund (PCSRF)

- **What does PCSRF fund?**

PCSRF funds projects that address productivity (most often habitat restoration), status and trend monitoring or the effectiveness monitoring, restoration planning or designing, building capacity, public outreach, and research.

- **Where does PCSRF funding come from?**

- Base Congressional Appropriation
- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
- Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)
